Stoughton Health has embraced technology by launching virtual community education and expanding virtual healthcare visits. We recently added urgent care virtual visits to our list of services. We are opening a new Urgent Care Clinic in McFarland in the spring of 2021, expanding quality services to more of our neighboring communities. Stoughton Health has initiated new health screenings and programs at the newly opened Community Health and Wellness Center and by moving the blood drive to the center, we've doubled the number of blood donors.

medical staff that want to practice at Stoughton Hospital, engaged employees and services accumulating to over \$4.1 Million for community benefits, and patients who report their experience are above state and national averages. COVID-19 Community Relief
